

Student Right-To-Know Act Disclosures for New York Institute of Massage 2018 Report

The Student Right-To-Know Act requires schools to disclose the following information to students.

1. Completion and graduation rates and, if applicable, transfer out rates for a specific cohort of the general student body. This cohort is of certificate - or degree seeking, **full-time, first-time** undergraduate students.
2. For schools that offer athletically related student aid, completion or graduation rates and, if applicable, transfer-out rates of students receiving athletically related student aid.

COMPLETION AND GRADUATION RATE FOR THE 2016 FULL YEAR COHORT

NYIM must make available no later than July 1st, 2019, the rates for the FULL YEAR Cohort for students that entered NYIM between September 1, 2015 and August 31, 2016.

The completion and on time graduation rate is the Completers / Graduates from the Full Year Cohort divided by the total Full Year Cohort.

$$\frac{\text{Completers/Graduates from the 2014 Full Year Cohort } \underline{16}}{\text{Total 2014 Full Year Cohort } \underline{22}} = 72.72 \%$$

COMPLETION AND GRADUATION RATE SEVEN YEAR AVERAGE

$$\frac{74.00\% (2012) \ 76.47\% (2013) \ 78.94\% (2014) \ 100\% (2015) \ 68.75\% (2016) \ 100\% (2017) \ 72.72\% (2018)}{7} = 81.61\%$$

SEVEN YEAR AVERAGE = 81.61%

Definitions:

Certificate- or degree seeking student: A student enrolled on a course for credit recognized by the school as seeking a degree or certificate.

First-time undergraduate student: an entering undergraduate who has never attended an institution of higher education.

Undergraduate students: students enrolled in a bachelor's degree program, an associate's degree program, or a vocational or technical program below the baccalaureate level.

Completer/Graduate: A student is counted as a completer or graduate if the student completed his or her program within 100% of the normal time for completion of the program.

Full-time: A student enrolled and attending, maintaining the minimum course load as required to obtain fulltime status.
